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ABOUT MARYLAND COMMUNITY CONNECTION

Maryland Community Connection is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization devoted to assisting each person to achieve a greater degree of social and economic independence.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

72 individuals in community-based employment. Job placement, training, and job retention, as well as advocacy for the individual in the workplace, assisting each to become a wage-earning and tax-paying citizen.

A Maryland Community Connection employment specialist is assigned to each participant and provides drop-in support and coaching directly.

SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

in partnership with the Maryland Division of Rehabilitation Services (MD DORS), MCC provides 85 students with severe disabilities in Prince George's County competitive summer job experiences for the 8th consecutive year.

LOW INTENSITY SUPPORT SERVICES (LISS)

One of only two LISS providers in the State of Maryland, serving over 1,500 individuals in Southern Maryland Region (5 counties) and the Eastern Shore Region (9 counties). Services include assistive technology, camp, daycare, health services, housing modifications, medical equipment purchases, personal care, respite, specialized equipment, therapeutic services, training and support for self-advocacy, and transportation assistance.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

28 children and adults are provided the supports and services necessary to improve independence at home and in their communities and have access to and participate in integrated community activities.

BASIC NEEDS PROGRAM

Children and adults with developmental disabilities receive with assistance with food, rent, utilities, uninsured medical expenses

SAFETY FIRST - PPE

Maryland Community Connection has distributed much needed Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and other necessities to individuals with developmental disabilities and their families during the pandemic. We are working hard to ensure the health and safety of individuals and staff.
